

# Junkyard Fairy

## Supplies you will need to bring:

- ◆ 18-gauge steel wire, 3 to 4 yards
- ◆ 28-gauge beading wire for hands, 1 spool; OR
- ◆ 2 lengths 20-gauge florist wire
- Wire cutters
- Scissors
- Needle and thread
- ◆ Tacky brand glue
- ◆ ½ block paper clay
- ◆ 4 small beads for eyes
- ◆ Orangewood stick
- Pin
- ◆ Metallic yarn for hands (red preferred but not mandatory)
- ◆ Yarn for hair
- ½ yard 1-inch thick quilt batting
- Selection of beads with large holes — big enough for the 18-gauge wire to go through
- Portable electric drill (if you have one)
- For the body of the fairy, I used a drilled wooden spool. Other possibilities: wooden tassel tops, building fragments, carvings, hardware pieces, jewelry parts, small purses — use your imagination.
- Wings — Example has woven collage wings, but other members of her family have wire wings, feather wings, metal wings, paper wings, crocheted wings, etc.
- ◆ Fabrics for clothes, shoes, trims and embellishments
- ◆ Paints for face
- 1 plastic sandwich bag
- Aluminum foil, approximately 10 x 10 inches
- Scotch tape
